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Felicity Collins is a member of the Kehewin Cree Nation reserve. She has attended the University of Alberta – Augustana Campus to obtain her Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology, before going further and completing an Afterdegree in Native Studies with Honors, where her focus was on the mental health of First Nations students in postsecondary environments.

During the years she was pursuing her postsecondary education, Felicity also received certificates in Aboriginal Sport and Recreation, and Aboriginal Governance and Partnership. During this time, she also worked as a Teacher's Assistant for various professors in the Native Studies Faculty and volunteered in student leadership and mental health initiatives.

Her professional career has spanned from providing programming and support for youth, both in the public sphere and for those in care, to providing an Indigenous lens through research and analysis on topics relating to Indigenous peoples for the Government of Alberta and non-profit organizations.
